Executive of the Big Lottery Fund recently in London. They discussed the changing environment local organisations are working in, including welfare benefit changes, devolution and evolving local priorities.

They also discussed how local groups need to remain focused on the things they were set up to do rather than drifting off course by chasing funding. It was an opportunity to highlight to the Big Lottery the valuable work local infrastructure does to help local groups understand and adapt to changes and new needs.

Assisted Living Centre opens

The official opening of the Assisted Living Centre (ALC) took place on 18th June 2015. (story by Vicky Campbell)

This is a project that I first became involved with back in 2012 when the first community steering group was first set up and back then was known as the Transforming Community Equipment Service, and had had a bit of a rocky start.

From a small, but dedicated, group of community representatives the service has been discussed, locations debated and the

community needs included.

The one thing that the whole steering group were clear on from the beginning was that this would not be rushed to fit the needs of the Commis-



sioners, but should take the necessary time to find the right location to fit the needs of the community and the needs of the service.

That decision has generated the incredible service that has been launched for the people of North East Lincolnshire today. Based in the Kingsley Grove building, that has been many things over the years and most recently home to podiatry and sexual health services, the service delivers, maintains and stores equipment for the benefit of the community.

The partnership between Northern Lincolnshire and Goole NHS Trust, North East Lincolnshire Clinical Commissioning Group and the community has seen the investment of £1.2 million into a service that is accessible and will meet the

needs of the community for many years to come and has seen the merger of a number of separate areas into one cohesive unit.

A big congratulations and thanks are owed to Trevor Knight, community representative, and Claire Rockall, Service Manager, Nic McVeigh, CCG Commissioner, and all the staff and community members who have contributed towards the project.


roles within volunteering and his enthusiasm for life. Andy is now one of more than 42,000 young people who has made a positive difference to their life and their community.

Linkage students power to success

Students at **Linkage College** in Lincolnshire have swept the board for the second year running in a national competition which challenges young people to build motorcycles.

Seven awards were won in the National Youth Bike

Competition 2015, surpassing last year's triumphant performance, as a result of a trike made by students with learning disabilities who study at Linkage's Grimsby and Toynton All Saints campuses. The final of the motorcycle building competition, aimed nationally at schools, colleges and youth groups, took place at Sir William Robertson Academy in Welbourn near Lincoln.

Linkage's battery-powered trike was created out of the front end and forks of a mini-moto, with a go-kart frame, the axle and motor from a mobility scooter and wood from an old set of drawers. It was developed through a project involving areas of Functional Skills such as English and Maths, over the academic year.

They won a wide range of awards including "Best of Show" from the Wolds' Bikers Motorcycle Club.

Members of the victorious team from both campuses will come together to receive individual medals at the Linkage College Graduation at Grimsby Minster on Tuesday 14th July.
