TLI update: Making Co-location work for you

We're continuing our retrospective look this month at the work VANEL did via the Transforming Local Infrastructure (TLI) project last year. This month: community asset co-location case studies.

In TLI, we tasked ourselves to examine local, real-world examples of how voluntary and community groups used buildings/assets in different models of co-location with other groups, businesses or services. These real-world "case studies" then supported our community assets manager in working with a wider range of organisations using the lessons learned (both positive and negative) from the case studies.

Using buildings to help voluntary sector groups to survive or grow sustainably is a common theme. One of the ways this can work well is through co-location with others - so that collectively each can support each other financially or through delivery of better services. Our case studies demonstrated numerous ways this works and numerous challenges. We did case studies on a community centre, a village hall, ourselves (at the Elms), a town council, tourist site and rural village.

The case studies were useful, in-depth and certainly helped VANEL to support other groups through development to better utilisation of their own buildings.

Unfortunately this aspect of TLI - supporting groups develop their assets, essentially concluded at the end of TLI. But VANEL still holds plenty of expertise in the role of co-location for groups, so if you would like to learn more, please contact Karl Elliott at VANEL.


An English princess who became a Danish queen had an affair with the royal physician. It is a very interesting film - a must see.

"East Coast 7"


