We did it! We delivered our first programme year targets on time, on budget and over achieved. We are so proud of everyone involved and are really excited for what year two will bring.

We believe that our team has made an excellent start on their programme of activities to develop young people as community development workers. The team members themselves have inspired and motivated wider involvement by young people in their respective communities by encouraging them to volunteer alongside them. The team has worked with existing groups of young people and enabled these groups to be even more active and helped them access funding to support their work.

The Enfuse team quickly established a strong work ethos amongst themselves and integrated exceptionally well within an already established team of experienced community based workers. They also worked very well with service providers in the voluntary sector who had a track record of delivering programmes to young people.

Team members are already being encouraged to look at their long term future within community development and we have been successful in getting some of the team to interview level for community development posts within the area. At present this is seen as a success as the feedback we get is "more experience needed" but "some really good forward thinking ideas".

The team have already started some of their next big ideas for the following year which includes some very exciting projects like establishing a unit in Freshney Place Shopping Centre as a hub to further engage more young people in their work. The team are already working on mentoring schemes and developing these to even higher levels to engage more challenging young people.


What's it all about?

GOVERNMENT GRANT GIVES GREEN LIGHT TO LINKAGE COMMUNITY TRUST

A new, £430,000 development at Linkage College in Grimsby will widen access to further education for young people with learning difficulties who also have physical disabilities. A two-storey building extension to the main MacKenzie Building at Linkage's Weelsby Road campus will offer a large physiotherapy room, extensive changing/wet room areas and flexible spaces to create personal tutorial and counselling rooms at the longest-established specialist further education college in the country, operated by the learning disability charity, Linkage Community Trust.

The Grimsby proposals have received full planning permission and Linkage hopes the building will be operational in 2015. It comes at an exciting time for Linkage College, which Ofsted stated in its 2013 inspection "offers outstanding outcomes for students".
