RAALI AWARDED AN OSSCA!

RAALI members recently attended the Outstanding Safer and Stronger Communities Awards (OSSCAs). This glamorous presentation ceremony took place at Cleethorpes Memorial Hall and was organised by the Safer and Stronger Communities Team and VANEL (Voluntary Action North East Lincolnshire) for the good people in North East Lincolnshire.

There were 9 award categories in total and the judging panel had to go through hundreds of nominations. Julie Peasgood, TV presenter and actress, and Rachel Munoz, Head of Housing at Shoreline Housing Partnership presented the award of 'Outstanding Community Safety Project Award' to RAALI for the work which has been carried out around road safety.

Additionally, the 'Lifetime Achievement Award' was presented to Surinda Khurana, Chairman of Communities Together for his work around Racial Equality and Justice. Surinda he has spent 11 years strengthening and promoting relationships between different races and cultures.

BUTT LANE LEISURE PARTNERSHIP

RAALI became a member of a Sub Group, which was chaired by a Laceby Parish Council (LPC) Councillor and tasked to address the possibility of a skate park in Laceby.

The Sub Group has held monthly meetings since forming in February 2013. In April, NELC announced its intention to stop maintaining the Laceby Bowls Greens. Residents had also become aware of the reduction in grass cutting around the children's play area.

These issues had affected the group's momentum to move forward. A vote was taken to approach the LPC to seek their intentions of ensuring the future of Laceby's sporting and leisure facilities on the Butt Lane site. During a difficult LPC meeting it was agreed to replace the LPC Sub Group with a community lead, independent village partnership.

The partnership is holding a public meeting:

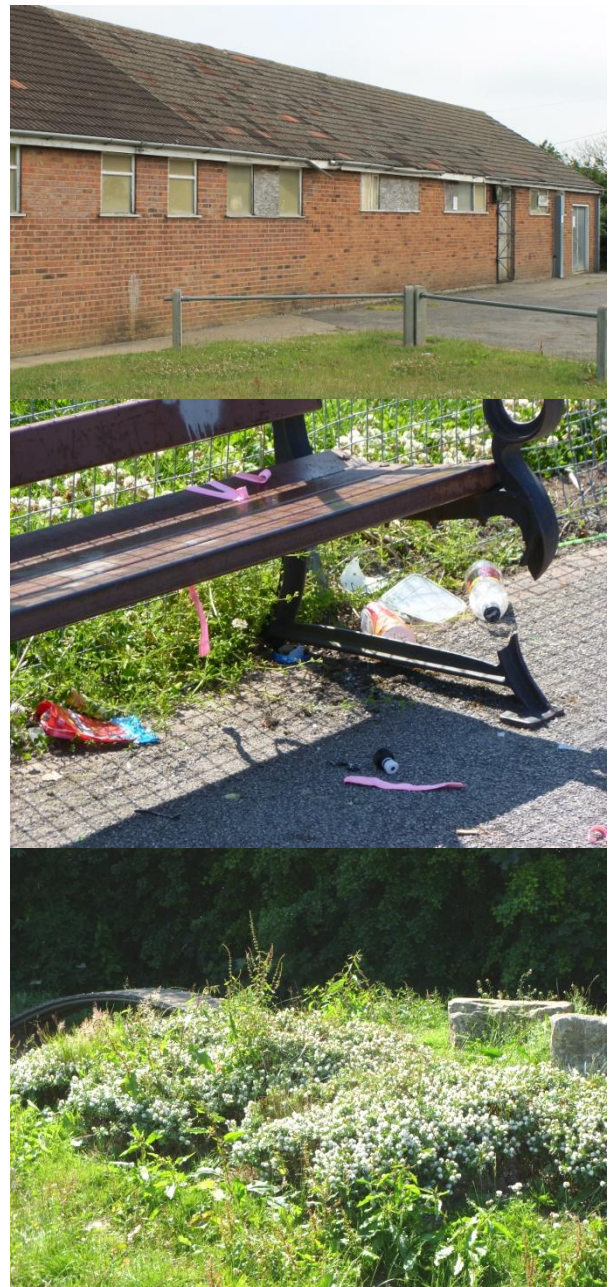

Said Ruth Snelson, Lincolnshire Chalk Streams Project Officer when she met with RAALI members and a local resident to discuss their ideas for a possible conservation and environmental project for Laceyby Beck. Ruth who works with other key partners explained the national rarity and environmental importance of chalk streams such as Laceyby Beck.

RAALI member Julie has also shared ideas with Green Futures and is working in partnership with both organisations and others. The aim of this will be to seek guidance & funding which will enable us to undertake a controlled conservation project that will preserve Laceyby Beck for the future and encourage wildlife. Financed by RAALI, the first step has been to improve the RAALI garden at the Beck. Green Futures and their volunteers have upgraded the garden using planting that will encourage bees and butterflies etc.
