Drop-In Sessions

A young man came into the drop-in during August, this year. He came for a food parcel as he had been on the streets for a few months and was currently sleeping in a shed.



He had lost his accommodation and had no benefits in place, meaning that he had no income at all.

We discussed that he would like to get into an out of area Foyer as he wanted to get away from Grimsby and his peer group, who he felt were a bad influence on him. He wanted to get into training or education and turn his life around.

We rang the ESA helpline to make an application for benefits. We rang the Foyer and explained the young man's situation. They conducted an interview with him over the telephone and said that they would ring him the next day with a decision.

Within a few days he was housed at the Foyer, in his chosen location.

The Foyer later told us they were supporting him with his ESA claim after we had helped him make the initial application.

The young man telephoned us yesterday and said how happy he is at the Foyer and is getting support from the staff there. We told him that if he was back in the area and needed further support to give us a call. He thanked us for the help and said he would definitely be back in touch if he was in the area.

Plum & Almond Crumble Slice

PREP: 15 MINS COOK: 1 HR, 5 MINS

Ingredients

250g pack butter (this must be very cold)
225g caster sugar
300g ground almond
140g plain flour, plus 25g/1oz
2 egg
1 tsp cinnamon
1 tsp baking powder
approx 6 plums, stoned and cut into sixths

Method

1. Heat oven to 180C/fan 160C/gas 4. Butter and line a 20 x 30cm baking tin with baking paper. Put the butter, sugar and ground almonds into a food processor, then pulse until the mixture resembles very rough breadcrumbs. Spoon out half the mix into a bowl and set aside.
2. Add 140g flour into the mix in the processor and whizz until it just forms a dough. Tip into the tin and press down with the back of a spoon. Bake for 15-20 mins until golden. Leave to cool for 10 mins.
3. To make the filling, put the remaining butter and the sugar and almond mix back into the processor, saving a few tbsp for the topping. Add the eggs, the 25g flour, cinnamon and baking powder and whizz to a soft batter. Spread over the base.
4. Top with the plum pieces and a little extra caster sugar and cinnamon. Bake for 20 mins, then sprinkle with the remaining crumble mix and flaked almonds. Cook for another 20 mins or until golden. Leave to cool in the tin before slicing.
