


Safer Streets West Marsh Wallet

Summary of Guidelines for Applicants

This grant scheme has a total of £20,000 to support a specific area within the West Marsh Ward of Grimsby and accepts applications from voluntary, community and not for profit organisations in North East Lincolnshire (ideally experienced in delivering services in that specific area) that can clearly demonstrate how their project contributes to following

Target Area of Benefit:

Projects must impact the area within West Marsh ward covered by the Lower Super Output Area **E01013221** outlined in blue on the map below, this being the area surrounded by and including: Earl Street; Lord Street; Boulevard Avenue and Macaulay Street.



Groups in areas that surround this geography can apply if they can clearly demonstrate that their project will positively impact residents living in the target area.

Priorities:

Projects should address one or more of these priorities:

- Designing out crime
- Making environmental improvements
- Tackling drug dealing /substance misuse
- Reducing/preventing acquisitive crime
- Preventing/tackling anti-social behaviour

Eligibility Criteria

You need to be able to show us that you are a not for profit (charitable) organisation by sharing your constitution and your latest set of audited or independently examined annual accounts/financial statements with us.

Your application needs to demonstrate that you are committed to supporting the delivery of one of more of the priorities as set out above for the benefit of residents in the target area.

Whether small or large your project will need to demonstrate or consider how sustainability for the project will be achieved beyond your project end date.

Application Process

Application form deadline	Panel date	Results announced

Successful applicants will receive an offer letter with information about the grant terms and conditions. Unsuccessful applicants will also be notified in writing. Panel decision is final.

Grant Conditions including Monitoring and Reporting

As soon as a signed copy of the offer letter has been returned to VANEL by the applicant the total grant amount will be awarded to the applicant organisation and transferred to the named organisation's bank account by credit transfer.

A mutually convenient monitoring visit will be undertaken once the project is underway. The date will be agreed in writing with the named contact person on the application form.

Once the project has been completed a final report on the outcomes of the project will need to be returned within 14 days of the project end date including photographs.

Grant Limits

Applicants may apply for up to £20,000. Projects must be completed by 31st March 2022.
